Here are a few tips to encourage your child's reading

Make reading fun - make it an event by creating a family reading night with treats as a reward.

- Make reading a family ritual read regularly with your children, a small amount each day is all it takes.
- Set an example they are more likely to read if they see you reading too.
- Praise and encourage your child encourage them to pick their own books or give them a choice of different books. If your child starts a book but doesn't finish it, that's okay. Praise them for trying or getting through a difficult book.
- ****** Explore what the libraries have to offer. We are not just about books we also have movies, puzzles, audiobooks and databases to explore.

- Would you like to be able to introduce yourself in Māori? Learn how to write your own Pepeha. Go to page 11 for instructions.






Stamp



When people formally introduce themselves in te reo, they often use a mihi or pepeha. This is a way of telling people where you come from and who your whānau (family) is.

Fill in the blanks below and write your own mihi or pepeha. This one is basic and easy to learn off by heart, but you can include much more in your mihi or pepeha if you wish. Have a look online for more examples.

A mihi is a greeting while a pepeha is a form of introduction that establishes identity and heritage. Within both mihi/pepeha we acknowledge the mountain and river we identify most with, where we come from and where we live now, who our whānau are, and finally our name. Fill in the blanks on the dotted lines to write your own introduction.



The next player builds a word, six letters or under, off the first player's word. This continues, taking turns until there is no more space to add words. Normal Scrabble rules for word placement apply. The last player to be able to place a word wins.


