### Teen Mural Project

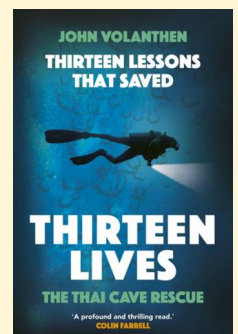
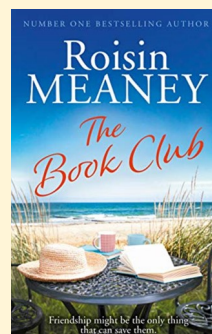
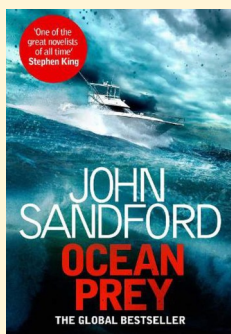
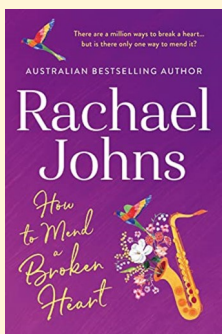
The culmination of weeks work by an inspired group of local 11-17 year olds has now been displayed on the Teen wall in Te Awamutu.

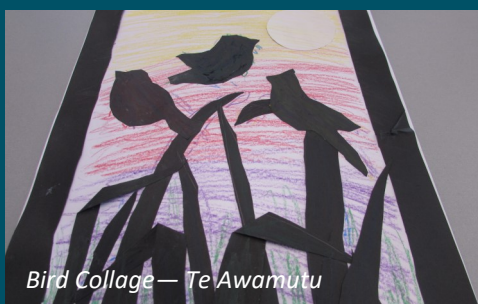
