Scavenger Hunt

Measure your items in centimetres or millimetres (depending on what may be the most appropriate). If you need to provide a measurement in metres, that's ok too! Use a ruler or a tape measure.

m – metres

cm – centimetres

mm – millimetres

g – grams

Item	Measurement
How long is your foot (from the back of your heel to the top of your big toe)?	
How long is your middle finger?	
What is the span of your hand? (Put your ruler on the table and place your thumb on the zero. Spread your hand wide and measure to the end of your little finger).	
What is the width of your bedroom door?	
What is the height of your bed?	
What is the height of a tower you can build from lego in one minute?	
If you have scales, how much does your smallest teddy weigh?	
What is the volume of the book you are reading? (Multiply the length by the width and the depth) Length (top to bottom) x Width (side to side) x Depth (measure the spine/height)	
Can you measure the circumference of a ball in your house? Take a piece of string and wrap it around the middle of the ball. Mark it with your finger, stretch it out and measure it on your ruler.	
What is the diameter of a round clock in your house? (This is the measurement from the edge directly across to the other side.) If you don't have a clock, use a cooking pot or bowl. Choose the largest one!
