1 Two chain link measures are embedded in the footpath somewhere between Robert Harris and the roundabout on Duke Street. Name a business one of them is closest to? <i>Hint: Walk along Victoria Street looking for this</i> →
2 Which horses have Walk of Fame plaques outside the BNZ?
3 What exhibit do you first come across as you enter Cambridge Museum on the left? Hint: The exhibit is in the glass case on your left as you enter, walking clockwise.
4 Name or describe the historic feature that exists at the Victoria Station Lolly Shop. Hint: Visit Victoria Station 55 Victoria Street.
5 Name one business located in the WH Cubis Building on Victoria Street. Hint: The building is located somewhere between the Alpha St and Duke St roundabouts.

6 'The Mare and the Foal' sculpture is outside the Town Hall. What initials are carved into the mare's front left leg?
7 What business occupies the building formerly known as the 'Pink Church'? Hint: It still has pink doors.
8 How many petals are on the flower (stained glass window) above the entry to St Andrew's Church? Hint: You are looking for the flower above the blue door Hamilton Road entrance.
9 How many fronds are on each side of the sculpture commemorating liberation of Le Quesnoy (Cambridge's Sister City)? Hint: Visit the memorial close to Lake Te Ko Utu/Thornton Road.
10 What is the name of the swamp located on the Cambridge and District Centennial Memorial Map? Hint: Visit the memorial close to Lake Te Ko Utu near Thornton Road/Victoria Street.
11 What is the first name on the Cambridge War Memorial Remembrance Plaque in Jubilee Gardens?
12 Name one of the businesses in the Power Board Buildings. Hint: Visit the Empire Street/Alpha Street corner.
13 Approximately how high is the stone marking the Cambridge Redoubt in Fort Street? Hint: No need to take a tape measure. Measure it against your body and measure that mark later!
14 What is the first item on the local history page of the Waipā District Libraries website?
