Let's Get Crafty/Matariki School Holiday Programmes

Waipā District Libraries is pleased to be able to offer an in-house school holiday programme once again these July school holidays.

The Let's Get Crafty programme runs from Monday 12 July to Friday 23 July, with a range of craft activities suitable for ages 5 to 12 years.

Now is also the time to celebrate Matariki—the start of the Māori New Year.

Join us in Cambridge on Saturday 10 July for songs (waiata), stories and star craft with Nell Ewens.

In Te Awamutu on Saturday 17 July Te Aroha Tauroa will be onsite to help children create three or four stars made from flax, paper and/or wool, which can then be made into a wall hanging or wearable art (brooch, ring, necklace or bolo (cowboy necktie).

New fees & charges Effective 1 July 2021

Waipā District Libraries new fees and charges now apply.

The great news is that a significant proportion of our adult book collection no longer attract a charge to borrow. In fact 95 per cent of items available in our libraries are now FREE to borrow.

For fiction readers, there is no charge to borrow books more than 2 years old (determined by the copyright date). New books (books which are two years old or less) are now \$1.50 and newer magazines \$1.

There is no longer a charge for eBooks. eAudio will remain at \$2.
